

# **Report of the Goochland County Citizen Noise Committee**

## I. Committee Formation

In spring 2019, several citizens spoke during Citizen Comment period at Board of Supervisors' meetings to express their concerns with noises disturbing the peaceful enjoyment of their homes and the absence of a noise ordinance in Goochland. In response, a community listening session was held on May 22, 2019.

Approximately 75 citizens attended the community listening session and expressed a variety of opinions about noise; there was both support and opposition for regulating noise. Those in favor of the county adopting a noise ordinance cited their loss of the quiet enjoyment of their residence or property due to repetitive and loud noises from animals, ATVs, firearms, fireworks, and music; those opposing additional noise regulation cited their personal freedoms and rights, protections of the county's agrarian environment, and the possibility of "weaponizing" noise against neighbors. A complete summary of the listening session remarks and citizen emails is attached as **Exhibit A**.

Given the citizen engagement on the topic of noise and in light of the 2010 Board's promise to revisit a noise ordinance in the future (see noise ordinance history below), the Board of Supervisors decided to appoint a group of representative citizens to a Citizen Noise Committee. The committee includes residents of each magisterial district as well as representatives of the county's business interests and apartment complexes. More significantly, though, the committee includes residents who expressed support for additional noise regulation as well as those who would prefer that the county not regulate noise.

## II. Noise Ordinance History

Before 2007, the county had a noise ordinance under which noise which was "unreasonably loud, disturbing, and unnecessary" constituted a criminal violation. In May 2007, Goochland County Circuit Court Judge Sanner ruled that Goochland's noise ordinance was unconstitutionally vague. In response to the Court's ruling, the ordinance was revised in 2008 to enumerate some specific standards for certain noises, but it continued to contain the "unreasonably loud, disturbing, and unnecessary" standard for noise violations. In 2009, the Virginia Supreme Court, in deciding a noise violation case from Virginia Beach, *Tanner v. City of Virginia Beach*, ruled that noise ordinance standards such as "unreasonably loud and annoying" were unconstitutionally vague for criminal noise violations.

In response to the Virginia Supreme Court decision, the county's noise ordinance was repealed and the County Attorney worked with a small group of residents who wanted the county

to adopt a new constitutionally supportable noise ordinance. After several months, the County Attorney and citizens drafted a new noise ordinance for consideration by the Board.

In October 2011, the Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on the newly proposed general noise ordinance (Attached as **Exhibit B**). More than 20 residents and the Sheriff spoke in opposition to the ordinance; it was not adopted. After the vote on the proposed ordinance, the Board stated that it would take a look at a noise ordinance again in the future.

In addition to the general noise ordinance, Goochland already had a nuisance ordinance for companion animals which included a noise component. Goochland County Code § 3-104 covered situations in which an owner failed to exercise proper control of a companion animal such that it became a nuisance by chasing vehicles, attacking other companion animals, causing damage to another person's property, interfering with a pedestrian's use of a public right of way, or making too much noise. There were residents working with the County Attorney to amend this noise standard as well. In February 2011, the Board adopted a noise provision for the companion animal nuisance ordinance which imposed a civil penalty when a companion animal's bark, whine, or other noise is "plainly audible" across a property line continuously or repeatedly for at least 60 minutes (6:00 a.m.-10:00 p.m.) or 30 minutes (10:00 p.m.-6:00 a.m.). Before a charge can be placed for a companion animal violation, notice of the nuisance must be sent to the violator by an animal control officer, law enforcement personnel, or the complainant.

### **III. Committee Meetings, Data, and Feedback**

At its inaugural meeting, in October 2019, staff briefed the committee members on the history of the county's noise ordinance and the existence of the companion animal nuisance ordinance. In addition, the full summary of the community listening session notes was provided to each committee member because they represent the best summary of the types of noise complaints residents have as well as the opinions of residents who are opposed to any noise regulation. Staff also made committee members aware of the state law process for residents to ask the Circuit Court to declare a nuisance pursuant to Virginia Code Sections 48-1 through 48-6. The issues of gun safety (neighbor's shooting being too close to someone's property) and fireworks (which are permitted only by fireworks permits) were identified as being outside the scope of the committee.

In December, staff briefed the committee on the state law authority and limitations for localities' noise regulations as well as considerations for how to regulate noise. Committee members were given and discussed the county's proposed 2011 noise ordinance and noise ordinances from Caroline, Bedford, Chesterfield, and Roanoke Counties. The committee members identified data they would like to receive and review, including county noise complaints for the past 10 years. That data was requested, provided by the Sheriff's Office, and sent to the committee members. The data covers 1/1/2009 through 7/30/2019 and contains approximately 981 noise complaints. While the Sheriff's data was organized by the date of the complaint, a committee member re-sorted the noise complaint entries so they appear alphabetically by street so it is easier to review where and how often complaints occurred. (Attached as **Exhibit C**).

Staff also sent committee members the minutes of the 2011 Board of Supervisors' meeting involving the consideration of the then-proposed noise ordinance. In January, the committee reviewed, analyzed, and discussed the county's noise complaints between January 1, 2009 and July 31, 2019. Committee members had some questions about this data and asked to have the Sheriff attend the next committee meeting. In addition, the committee asked to receive noise complaints from Louisa, Powhatan, Fluvanna and Hanover counties.

Due to the pandemic, the committee did not meet again in spring 2020; however, noise complaint information from Louisa, Powhatan, Fluvanna and Hanover counties was obtained and sent to the committee members. To determine where and how growth was likely to be coming to the county, staff sent the committee the county's map of zoned but unbuilt residential lots. There was a request to determine whether county noise complaints increased dramatically after March 1, 2020 – when the pandemic had caused many people to remain home, potentially even for work. There were 30 Goochland noise complaints between March 1, 2020 and June 16, 2020 according to the data provided by the Sheriff's office and sent to the committee (Attached as **Exhibit D**).

The committee next met in person and via conference call on July 1, with Sheriff Creasey and Major East in attendance. Sheriff Creasey and Major East provided information about noise complaints and answered the committee's questions about the types of calls for service the Sheriff's office receives. The Sheriff noted that when a deputy appears at someone's residence, most people voluntarily decrease or stop the noise which has annoyed their neighbor. Sheriff Creasey told the committee he was open to noise regulation. He expressed a concern that enforcement of a noise ordinance could take deputies away from other calls and that, on any given shift, there may be only four deputies on duty and responding to all calls from anywhere in the county's 284 square miles, including crashes on I-64 or I-288. After the Sheriff and Major concluded their comments and discussion with the committee, they left. The committee members then outlined some general parameters for a proposed noise ordinance, including that it address only repetitive noise that would constitute a nuisance, that it not apply to any commercial or industrial noise, that it exempt agricultural activities, and that a warning be required.

A draft nuisance noise ordinance was sent to committee members about a week before the committee's September 14 meeting. At the meeting, the committee members went through the draft ordinance line by line, discussing each provision, asking questions, and suggesting revisions. The ordinance was updated both during the meeting and shortly thereafter. The September 14 version of the proposed ordinance was sent to the committee members, as well as to the Sheriff's Office, and Commonwealth's Attorney.

At the committee's October 5 meeting, the committee members again went through the draft ordinance line by line, discussing each provision, asking questions, and suggesting revisions. The Commonwealth's Attorney's feedback prompted two revisions (removing posting the warning and requiring the warning to be sent certified mail). In addition, the committee members began to identify the provisions about which they had differences of opinion, so those differences could be included in this report. Revisions were again made to the ordinance during the meeting and in the days following. An updated ordinance was sent to committee members on October 22 and it was also sent to the Sheriff's Office and the Animal Protection Office. Staff spoke with the Animal Protection Office about the companion animal nuisance ordinance and its similar warning

provision. Staff also met with the Sheriff's Office about the proposed ordinance and questions the committee members had raised.

On November 5, a draft committee report and the October 22 proposed ordinance was sent to the committee. The committee next met on November 16. Staff told the committee about the failure of Buckingham County's recent noise ordinance amendment, due to a substantial number of residents speaking at the public hearing in opposition to the increased regulation of gunfire in the proposed revision. Staff relayed the Sheriff's Office feedback, including that an upcoming new CAD system will improve the accuracy of addresses recorded for noise complaints. The Sheriff said that deputies need to engage in off-duty target practice to maintain their required weapons proficiency. The Sheriff expressed concern about the subjectivity of sheriff's deputies having to determine if the noise is a nuisance and expressed support for complainants being added to the ordinance as persons who can provide the written warnings (similar to the companion animal nuisance ordinance). The Sheriff noted that the Circuit Court Judge had struck down the county's last noise ordinance. The Sheriff also supported the proposed apartment complex exemption. The Sheriff cautioned that some neighbors may "pad the call data" by calling the Sheriff's office regularly with a noise complaint.

Resident Jonathan Lyle attended the committee's November 16 meeting and provided his feedback about the proposed ordinance. He appreciated the committee's desire to exempt agricultural activities from the ordinance and recommended adding language to the exemption that would specifically capture all activities in the Right to Farm Act. He expressed that "unreasonably", "substantially", "disturbs", and "interferes" are subjective standards and that decibel measurements would be an objective standard. He stated he would like to see the hunting exemption expanded to include all lawful firearm activity. Finally, he stated that the ordinance covers residential dwellings even if they are on large agriculturally zoned parcels. He stated that he would share the proposed ordinance with the Goochland Farm Bureau staff and the directors of the Monacan Soil and Water Conservation District.

The committee discussed and approved making several changes to the proposed noise ordinance, as follows: revising the agricultural activities exemption to include all activities in the Right to Farm Act, exempting apartment complexes, eliminating from "persons responsible" owners who are not present when the noise is occurring, and revising the warning language to more closely match the companion animal nuisance ordinance.

The committee's recommended changes were incorporated into a new ordinance draft dated December 3, 2020. This draft also included staff revisions improving the language and reorganizing ordinance provisions. The December 3 draft ordinance was sent to the committee members, the Commonwealth's Attorney, the Sheriff, Jonathan Lyle (for both the Monacan Soil & Water Conservation District and the Goochland Farm Bureau), Virginia Farm Bureau President Wayne Pryor, Retreat at West Creek property manager Eric Yim, and 2000 West Creek property manager Brina Brigham. In addition, the December 3 draft ordinance was provided to the county's community development director for review.

Based on feedback from the county's community development director, the proposed ordinance was changed to reword the apartment complex exemption, and to add "approved" to the exemption for business and commercial activities at residential dwellings.

Virginia Farm Bureau President and Goochland resident Wayne Pryor provided feedback on the proposed ordinance, requesting that the agricultural exemption include tree harvesting and timber cutting; further, he stated that he hoped the ordinance would not prohibit target practice or occasional clay shooting activities that occur during the daytime and last a couple of hours. In response to these comments, the agricultural activities definition was revised to specifically exempt noise from the production or harvest of trees and timber.

Jonathan Lyle provided staff with an email containing feedback on the November 5 draft committee report from the Virginia Farm Bureau's government relations personnel, Andrew Smith. Mr. Smith stated that the draft committee report should not include a reference to best management practices in the state Right to Farm Act; consequently, that reference was removed from the committee report.

Jonathan Lyle reported to staff that no formal action was taken by the Monacan Soil and Water Conservation District Commission, but that the directors were aware of the ordinance and its exemption for agricultural activities. Mr. Lyle also stated that he forwarded the proposed ordinance to the Goochland Farm Bureau staff and asked that it be provided to that organization's directors. The Goochland Farm Bureau did not take any action on the proposed ordinance or provide any specific feedback on the agricultural activities' exemption or any other portion of the proposed ordinance.

Staff met with Commonwealth's Attorney Mike Caudill about the proposed ordinance. He said that a nuisance can be determined from the totality of the circumstances and noted that the ordinance contained specific criteria to be reviewed to make a nuisance determination. He noted that certified mail was an appropriate method to provide the written warning. He stated that the burden of proof for a violation under the proposed ordinance would be a preponderance of the evidence (as opposed to the proof beyond a reasonable doubt standard for criminal charges). Mr. Caudill did not request any revisions to the proposed ordinance.

With respect to the exemption for the apartment complexes, staff exchanged emails with committee member Eric Yim (property manager for Retreat at West Creek) in November in which Eric had expressed support for the exemption, but staff received no additional feedback from him after sending the proposed ordinance with the apartment exemption added. Despite several emails and phone messages from staff, the property manager for 2000 West Creek did not provide any feedback on the proposed ordinance with the apartment complex exemption.

At a January 7, 2021 meeting, the proposed noise ordinance was presented to the county's senior staff and their feedback was requested. No revisions were proposed or sought. Sheriff Creasey attended the meeting and stated that the Sheriff's Office deputies are concerned about the proposed ordinance's potential impact on their ability to target practice at their homes, which is necessary for them to do in order to maintain their weapons proficiency.

The committee next met on January 11, 2021. Staff provided the committee members with the feedback (set forth above) obtained since the last committee meeting. An article was also provided about a California situation in which one person harassed his neighbor by repetitively blaring the "Gilligan's Island" theme song and other music. In addition, staff advised the committee about a recent land use case for a private club that wanted to include an outdoor gun range; numerous residents had spoken in opposition to the outdoor gun range, and the applicant ultimately withdrew that portion of the application.

Staff told the committee that the negative feedback on the proposed ordinance has been directed at its potential impact on lawful shooting. The committee members discussed that shooting complaints can be about the safety of the shooting (which is outside the purview of this committee) rather than about the noise, but they also acknowledged that there were residents on the committee and at the community meeting who had specifically complained about the noise of repeated gunfire, especially when it occurs for several hours each weekend.

There was discussion amongst committee members that they want to protect residents' Second Amendment rights to shoot firearms. The committee supports residents' rights to target shoot and sight their firearms on their residential property. However, there is a point at which continuous and repetitive gunfire can become a nuisance that disturbs the peaceful enjoyment of a neighbor's residence.

Given the committee members' concerns about negative feedback to the proposed ordinance and because the December 31 draft committee report had inadvertently not been sent to committee members for review, the committee decided to hold another meeting in February to further review the draft report and continue to consider the negative feedback regarding the proposed ordinance's impact on shooting.

The committee met on February 25. Staff advised the committee that the Sheriff did not feel he could support the noise ordinance because its restriction on firearms use would limit sheriff's deputies' ability to practice firearms skills at their homes. Staff had discussed with the Sheriff two possible revisions to address these concerns, specifically a proposed law enforcement exemption and a proposal to exempt firearm noise if less than 2-3 hours, but neither proposal fully addressed the Sheriff's concerns, and the majority of the committee members did not support the proposals. The committee members reviewed each provision of the draft report and scheduled a meeting for March 22 to review the proposed presentation of the report to the Board of Supervisors.

A revised draft report and the draft PowerPoint slides for presenting the report to the Board of Supervisors was sent to the committee members on March 15 and posted to the county's website. The committee met on March 22 and reviewed both documents, suggesting several revisions.

The revisions were made to the report and the PowerPoint presentation to be made to the Board of Supervisors at the April 6, 2021 meeting.

## IV. Proposed Nuisance Noise Ordinance

### Goochland County Code Chapter 10 Offenses Article II Noise Nuisances

#### 10-41 Purpose.

Residents should be able to use and enjoy their homes free from repetitive noise that rises to the level of a nuisance. To that end, this article prohibits the creation of a noise nuisance on residential property which, by virtue of its volume, pitch, duration, repetition, and time of day, unreasonably and substantially disturbs or interferes with someone else's peaceful enjoyment of their residential property.

#### 10-42 Definitions.

*Agricultural activities.* The raising or keeping of animals, fowl, or bees; the production or harvest of all crops including: fruits, vegetables, meat, dairy, poultry, fiber, nuts, tobacco, trees, timber, and flowers or other nursery products; the production or harvest of products from silviculture and aquaculture activity; and other, similar activities. Any activities added in the future to the definition of "agricultural operation" in the Right to Farm Act, Virginia Code § 3.2-300, are incorporated by this reference.

*Nuisance.* A nuisance is something that injuriously affects public safety or health, or which causes a material, substantial, repetitive, and unreasonable interference with the private use and enjoyment of another person's residential property.

*Residential property.* Residential property means any property on which one or more dwelling units exist, regardless of the property's zoning designation. For residential property containing more than one dwelling unit, a noise violation may be found if the noise generated in one dwelling unit or in a common area creates a noise nuisance in another dwelling unit located on the same property; however multifamily structures operated by a management company are exempt from this article.

#### 10-43 Noise Nuisance Violation.

##### A. Noise nuisance.

It is a violation of this article for any person to intentionally or unintentionally make repetitive noise, or allow the making of repetitive noise, except the noises exempted below, on residential property that, by reason of its volume, pitch, duration, repetition, and time of day, unreasonably and substantially disturbs or interferes with someone else's peaceful enjoyment of residential property they own, rent, or occupy.

##### B. Persons responsible.

Any person who controls the noise source can be held responsible for a violation, but if that person cannot be reasonably ascertained, then any owner, tenant, resident or occupant who is

physically present on the residential property during the nuisance noise, and to whom the required warning has been provided can be held responsible.

**C. Warning.**

No person shall be found in violation of this article unless there has been presented before the court competent evidence that the complainant or a law enforcement official had, prior to the issuance of any summons or warrant, requested the abatement of the nuisance complained of, and that such nuisance continued after the request for abatement. Written notice of the violation must be sent, certified mail, return receipt requested, to the property from which the noise nuisance emanated and, if a different address is listed for the property owner on the county's geographic information system (GIS), also to the property owner(s) at the address shown in GIS.

**10-44 Exemptions.**

The following are exempt such that nuisance noise from them cannot form the basis of a noise nuisance:

1. Agricultural activities;
2. Approved business or commercial activity on residential property;
3. Companion animal noises which violate Code § 3-104; and
4. Hunting that is lawful under state and local laws and regulations.
5. Activities permitted by zoning, special events permits, parade permits, fireworks permits, or other governmental approvals;
6. Multi-family structures operated by a management company; and
7. Activities for which noise regulation has been pre-empted by federal law.

**10-45 Penalties.**

A. Violations of this article carry a civil penalty not to exceed \$250 for the first offense and not to exceed \$500 for subsequent offenses.

B. The public nuisance procedures set forth in Virginia Code § 48-1 et. seq. may be used for violations of this article.

C. If the violation is unabated at the time of a court finding, the court shall order the violator to abate or remedy the violation in compliance with this article within a time period established by the court. Failure to abate or remedy the violation within the specified time period shall constitute a separate violation.

D. In addition to and not in lieu of the other penalties, the county may apply to the circuit court for an injunction against any continuing, including intermittently continuing, violation of this article, and may seek any other remedy or relief authorized by law.

## **V. Committee Perspectives**

### **A. Noise Regulation Generally**

The committee reached a consensus on the proposed nuisance noise ordinance, but there is still a minority perspective that no noise ordinance needs to be adopted. One committee member points to the low number of noise complaints received by the Sheriff during the start of the COVID pandemic (March-June 2020) as evidence that noise is not an issue the county needs to address. The majority perspective of the committee, though, is that there are too many noise complaints and problems, based both on the noise complaint data and the May 2019 listening session, not to address it with the proposed ordinance and that the current and future rate of residential development in the county will only exacerbate the current noise problems if the ordinance is not adopted.

### **B. Applicable Only to Residential Dwellings and Residential Activity**

The committee believes in individual property rights and wants to protect those rights unless someone creates noise that is a nuisance interfering with someone else's right of quiet enjoyment at their residential dwelling. Accordingly, the ordinance regulates only noise from residential activity which becomes a nuisance by disturbing someone else at their residence. The ordinance does not apply to noise generated on any commercial, industrial, or business properties. To provide the broadest possible exemption for commercial activity, the ordinance also contains an exemption for approved business or commercial activity on residential property.

Residential property is broader than the zoning category and covers agriculturally zoned property it that contains a dwelling unit. The definition includes not only single-family dwellings, but also townhomes, and trailer parks. On properties that contain more than one dwelling unit, the ordinance is intended to cover noise from one dwelling unit to another, or from a common area to a dwelling unit. The committee chose to exempt from the ordinance apartment complexes large enough to have a management company because the management company is the best arbiter of what noise is acceptable within its property and it has the opportunity to take action against a resident who creates noise that annoys neighbors.

### **C. Nuisance Noise Standard**

The committee wanted to make sure that this was not just a "noise" ordinance whereby a single instance of annoying noise would be a violation. The word nuisance had been used by many residents who spoke at the community meeting. The committee adopted noise nuisance as the standard that must be met before a violation occurs under the ordinance. The committee included a specific requirement that the noise must be repetitive and then established the following criteria to consider in determining if a noise nuisance has occurred; consideration of volume, pitch, duration, repetition and time of day determine if a repetitive noise rises to the level of a nuisance.

## **D. Agricultural Exemption**

Recognizing that Goochland is a rural county, the committee wanted to adopt a very broad exemption for noises from agricultural activities. In crafting the agricultural activities exemption, the committee began with the activities specifically identified in the Right to Farm Act, Virginia Code § 3.2-300, but the committee also expanded the definition to specifically include additional activities. The committee also incorporated recommendations to expand the exemption to include trees and timber and to include any activities which are added to the Right to Farm Act in the future.

## **E. Warning Required**

The committee wanted to ensure that people would receive a warning that the noise they created was considered a nuisance to their neighbor before they could be found in violation of the ordinance. The warning language in the proposed ordinance is similar to the language in the Companion Animal Nuisance ordinance, except this proposed ordinance specifically requires that written notice be provided by certified mail, return receipt requested, as was recommended by the Commonwealth's Attorney. Based on the Sheriff's feedback, and similar to the Companion Animal Nuisance ordinance, the warning can come from a complainant or law enforcement personnel; this provision allows more opportunity for notice to be given with less impact on the Sheriff's resources. The issuance of a warning from law enforcement personnel also provides a third-party check against one neighbor abusing the ordinance by issuing a warning when the noise doesn't rise to the level of a nuisance. The committee felt that the ordinance's requirement that a complainant appear before a magistrate about a violation provided a third-party review of the situation which would prevent a noise situation from being "weaponized" between neighbors.

## **F. Firearms**

It was agreed that lawful hunting is also part of the county's rural character; accordingly, the committee included an exemption for lawful hunting. When the proposed ordinance has been circulated for comment, the provision that has generated the most negative feedback is that it doesn't contain an exemption for all lawful shooting. Some committee members supported an exemption for the lawful discharge of any firearms, but the majority of committee members did not.

A large number of the noise complaints from the community meeting involved excessive shooting, so the majority of the committee members felt shooting should not be completely exempted from the ordinance. The committee expressed support for residents' Second Amendment rights and acknowledged that target shooting on residential property is a common activity that is not prohibited by the ordinance. Shooting is only regulated to the extent that someone engages in it such that its repetition, duration, volume, and time of day creates a nuisance at someone else's nearby residential dwelling. The situations described by people concerned about the application of this ordinance include: shooting clays for a couple of hours, sheriff's deputies' target shooting to maintain their firearms skills, and other residents target shooting at their homes. Ultimately, the

committee concluded that all of these activities should be able to occur without becoming a nuisance to a nearby residential dwelling.

Pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-917, preexisting shooting ranges are exempt from this noise ordinance.

### **G. Other Issues**

Intentional noise is included in the ordinance because the committee became familiar with the Goochland situation where one neighboring property owner was intentionally creating a noise nuisance for residents of the Reader's Branch subdivision by constantly playing music, sometimes one song ("Baby Shark") repetitively. The committee wanted to ensure that the intentional creation of a noise nuisance would be considered a violation of the ordinance.

While the best enforcement action will be against the person who controls the noise source, the committee recognized that person may not always be reasonably ascertained; if so, then other persons associated with the property and physically present during the creation of the nuisance can be held responsible, if they receive the required warning and continue the noise nuisance activity.

The county already regulates noises from companion animals, so they are not covered under this ordinance. Some committee members stated that dog barking was one of the major complaints at the community meeting; however, many residents had devoted significant time, thought, and effort in creating the 2011 revision of the noise standard in the companion animal nuisance ordinance and there was no evidence that the complaints could not be addressed through that ordinance.

The committee chose to enforce the nuisance noise ordinance through the civil penalty permitted pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-980. The other authority for enforcing either nuisances or general county code ordinance violations are also included in the penalty paragraph.

## **VI. Action by the Board of Supervisors**

Upon receipt of this report, the Board of Supervisors may decide to take any of the following actions:

1. Hold community meetings on the proposed nuisance noise ordinance.
2. Set a public hearing on the proposed nuisance noise ordinance.
3. Ask the Citizen Noise Committee to perform additional research, collect additional information, or consider a different perspective and report back.
4. Take any other action.

County Administrator Budesky spoke to the format for the evening, of hearing from residents on both sides of the noise ordinance issue. The Board has not decided as of this evening what our next steps are going to be, that is what this session is about. We want to hear from our residents, we have heard from many who are calling, emailing and writing letters sharing their perspectives. For this evening, staff will be sharing some brief information as it relates to noise regulation in Goochland, a historical data, and will open the floor to hear from you and stated we are tracking information provided this evening. Mr. Budesky stated we will go to about 7:30 PM with public feedback at which time we will break into smaller groups for a more one on one with folks who want to share and talk through their perspectives on the concern, no decision will be made this evening, this is simply a process to gain feedback for the Board to consider and direct staff appropriately.

Mr. Budesky gave a brief overview of the noise ordinance history of the county (2006-2014) stating we are aware that some jurisdictions have noise ordinances, some do not. The County had noise ordinances on our books that were deemed non-legally sufficient; there are still jurisdictions that we know of in this region that have noise ordinances on the books that may, or may not be fully, legally sufficient.

County Attorney McGee shared what regulation(s) we have in place today. Ms. McGee stated while we do not have a noise ordinance it does not mean that all noises are unregulated in the County. One of the ways that noise is regulated that you may not be aware of, and more particularized, is very often when something is approved with a conditional use permit, it may well have some form of regulation of the noise/activity that is going to occur with that (examples of wedding, events, amplified noise, timeframes, etc.). Also, here in Goochland, we have activities that have existed for many years and now development is occurring perhaps in close proximity to that. For example, Luck Stone Quarry, south of Patterson, has been there since 1926, but when a subdivision wanted to go in across the street, one of the proffers in that case was that every deed in that subdivision has to notify the owner that there is a quarry across the

street and there is going to be big trucks, noise and your moving next to it, so a zoning condition to let residents know of something nearby that may bother you.

A general applicability that the county has had since 2008, a companion animal nuisance ordinance, a big part of that is barking, whining of dogs and other sorts of companion animals, it's not about agriculture animals, that ordinance does cover things like damaging somebody else's property or interfering with pedestrians, so when talking about a nuisance ordinance it does talk about the noise you get from that companion animal but it will also cover some of those other behaviors that are a nuisance to neighbors. Those are what we have on the books that we do to try and make citizens comfortable about what is happening around them but we do not have a countywide noise ordinance.

Mr. Budesky spoke briefly to the flow charts in the front of the room, we are interested to know what your particular perspectives are: are you for or against a noise ordinance, what noises and noise types are of concern to you, some noise may be of concern to one person but not another, trying to make sure to get that perspective. Conversely, if you are not interested in noise and all noises are fine by you, we want to know that as well, we want to capture both sides of the perspective. We are trying to understand the issues from our resident's perspective and how to take these concerns and draft something that is meaningful if the Board decides to go that route. Also, is your concern more or a residence issue or more of a countywide issue of concern, is it more of an issue during the night, daytime or no matter when it happens an issue. It is also important to know that we do have businesses that already generate noise, it may be part of their business operation, whether a restaurant that has a band, or a mining operation. We have a lot of agricultural uses, that is our number one producer in this county, a lot of noise from agricultural uses that we have to be sensitive to as we think about any noise regulation, there is always balance when you think about regulation, period.

Mr. Budesky asked citizens to be respectful with their time at the microphone when sharing their perspectives; all will get a chance to speak and around 7:30PM we will break into smaller groups.

Richard Willis, 2740 Perkinsville Road, Maidens, stated he has lived in the county for 15 years, last 6-7 years a lot of problems in his neighborhood, started with fighting roosters - crowing incessantly daybreak until dusk, neighbor down from next door neighbor had a pit bull, tied the pit bull up who barked from 4:00-6:30P after dinner, in 2017/2018 people moved in next door and brought their ATV's, ATV's ran all day on Saturdays from 8A-11A break for lunch, started up at 1P and ran til dark, ATV's can really get on your nerves. Canvassed his neighborhood and talked to 94 people, of the 94, 90 signed petitions asking for the county to draft a noise ordinance (copy submitted for file), shows tremendous amount of interest in, appreciates the County listening, this is an issue that needs to be addressed. Spoke to other counties for example,

Hanover, Henrico, Chesterfield, Powhatan, Cumberland, Fluvanna, Louisa, they all have noise ordinances, and have had them for years and they enforce them, even spoke to Nelson County and Buckingham County, copies of information presented, doesn't understand how our County is on the outline, talked with the Sheriff's office who printed a record of information and according to that office, since 2008 – 2018, there were 948 noise complaints, that's a lot of noise, given the fact that we don't have a noise ordinance thinks not much was done in those cases, (didn't get full detail of reports) but doubts any citations were issued because of no effective noise ordinance at the time, demonstrates a problem.

Unidentified citizen spoke to the need for a mark on the flow chart for ATV's and dog noise, we need a regulation everywhere on all parts of the county, day/night, police officers need some kind of tool to respond to these issues. Lives in Rockville area, homes all around, neighbor had 13 dogs in his kennel, not against the rules, kept us up day and night sometimes, it was horrible, we ended up getting a lawyer, and because there was no noise ordinance, the attorney looked at it as a nuisance and researched the law and were ready to take the individual into court and basically ended up paying him a \$1000 to get rid of his dogs, because of no other recourse. You need to provide some type of regulation that is enforceable, of why we have a county attorney, can't imagine that others are not grappling with this same issue, of the need for a way to stop some of this nonsense.

Catherine O'Brien, 2310 Pony Farm Road mentioned the reference to a nuisance ordinance for dogs done in 2008, that is not exactly true. A lot of dog owners got together and hired an attorney, we met with Norman (former county attorney), went back and forth, 2012/2013, of numerous meetings, we packed the Board of Supervisors meetings, of working groups - people that had issues came, referenced Section 3.104 that is on the books right now - that was a lot of money spent by the citizens because we went in together and hired an attorney to help work with the county and so what is on the books is enforceable, it's a good, working solution. We must have a time to turn out our dogs, time limit of 6AM-10PM, this is a good working solution and does not want this to be lost because people want a noise ordinance.

Ms. O'Brien stated she is kind of neutral on the noise ordinance personally, has a neighbor that likes to shoot guns, it's not really a gun but a hand cannon, a 357, if I take his rights away I'm taking my own away. So she doesn't complain, you have to do what you have to do, main message is that she does not want the companion animal nuisance ordinance lost in this process, we have been through it, we have spent hours and hours, attorneys have met and it is something workable, doesn't want that overlooked in this process.

Susan Ellis, 1800 Manakin Road stated she lives where we are experiencing growth and increased activity by newcomers, we still call ourselves a rural community, is a proponent of hay bales, hunting, dogs, her concerns come from two parts: one is safety and the other is good

neighbor. Has been in this county for 55 years, grew up in this county, left for a while, retired military, returned to county has seen a lot of growth. When little a lot of vegetation, a lot of space between us, cows, pigs, dogs ruled, you could have any animal, anywhere and you didn't need to be concerned, now we have to think about being good neighbors, so it is from a safety aspect as well as good neighbor aspect. You have to consider businesses and people within a short distance, you want to still have your liberties and right's, but you need to be cognizant and considerate of others. About a year ago acquired a neighbor that can shoot for 50 minutes at a time, every 7 seconds, shoots anything from a .22 to a semi-automatic weapon, she has horses jumping out from under her, cows having babies, horses running through fences, dogs just about falling down in the yard and a few doors down you have a business and you have their customers running out into the street and running for town, we are a county that is going to grow, some more growth than others sooner. But if we want to endorse progress, if we want to endorse growth and people, and they are going to come, we have to do something just as we do with dog leash laws or any other ordinance we have, we have to have something that helps us help those who do not think about being respectful, is not trying to take rights away, is one of those things we need to think about. That her mom had a stroke during a fireworks display, the fireworks have become a major catastrophe in the Manakin Road area, they are not just one location that has a permit if required, they are everywhere and we have animals impeding fences, animals giving birth, it is a major dilemma and the noise level almost shakes your house like an earthquake. Sometimes we are coming down hard on good working people driving trucks going to work now, and that is not the problem so much, those trucks need to go to work (these folks with Luck Stone, someone planned and made folks aware), now in our area we have people moving into that area saying we should have people barred from driving their truck to work and they have been driving that truck to work for the last 50 years and doing it respectfully. I am talking about lack of respect, anybody is going to have a dog that barks, of pit bulls from the same residence that had excessive gun fire coming in my yard after my horses, to the point she is afraid to turn them out. You would think after night fall this kind of thing would stop, but it hasn't, they must have a flood light and do it 10-11PM at night with rapid fire. I need you to do something to keep me safe, do something that keeps my family member safe, people need to use good judgement and not infringe upon others.

Marcelyn Ellis, 1750 Manakin Rd., sits on her front porch anytime there is a holiday or wedding at the nearby country club, Hermitage Country Club, and watching fireworks, we are guaranteed a free firework show, we don't have to come up to Goochland and watch it anymore. There needs to be some kind of limitation on those fireworks, a family member that goes into mini-strokes from fireworks that is a serious issue, is a farmer and retired teacher, has 20 cows, cows aborting babies and last year on the Fourth of July, two cows had a baby the same night within a few hours, it's too much, something needs to be done, we cannot be a civilized society without some laws in place to govern all of this.

Larry Roberts, 2986 Lowry Rd., purchased a piece of land a year ago, came to Goochland because he wasn't controlled by what he could do on his land, lived in Chesterfield County area for 39 years, had to paint mailbox a certain color, couldn't build this type shed in backyard, people left letters in mailbox because he didn't cut his grass at culvert pipe, that was one reason he came to Goochland County because he didn't want to be controlled by that anymore. Does believe there needs to be some type of ordinance for the barking dogs, has a neighbor that has a kennel full of dogs that sounds like about 15 of them, at night time they bark a lot but the only time he hears them is when he is outside, wants to be careful, like someone going into the smoking area and complaining about smoking. Moved to the country because I want to be able to shoot guns, ride ATV's or have a party with loud music and need to be tolerant of the people next to me for what I want to do, as long as within reason. Doesn't like being controlled by regulations so much, we do need some regulations in place to keep things from getting too wild, moved to Goochland because he was not going to be regulated and does like when he can shoot guns on his farm, is a respectful neighbor, doesn't shoot at 11P or 12A, saw neighbor and told them we are going to have people out this weekend, we will be riding some ATV's, having a good time, come join us.

Kara Beville of Gum Spring spoke to dogs and regulation, feels for both sides, doesn't want her rights taken away either, doesn't believe this is a noise ordinance in her mind to control how they use their property, moved out for the country life, peaceful setting, one neighbor parties until 3A in the morning, walls shake with child asking what is the noise, ATV's running up and down the driveway every Sunday, new neighbor shooting anything from a 357 to an assault rifle right into her backyard where children play so she cannot let her children go outside. Spoke to dogs, that she has multiple dogs, she is a second amendment person, thinks over a certain number of dogs they have to be licensed (kennel), companion piece, there are jerks in our world who do not respect you or your property or your child, they are shooting on their 9 acres off their deck, doesn't think we need a noise ordinance, we need a nuisance noise regulation, focusing on the people who are really obnoxious and take it to excessive levels, shooting on your property – we do it, is a second amendment person – big gun advocate right here don't take anybody's rights away, but be respectful of other people, let's neighbor know she is going to target shoot, can shoot for 30 minutes or an hour and gun goes back in safe and we are done, doesn't target shoot 4-6 hours a day on her property. At a time, it wasn't a residential area, we had 20 acres behind us, now it has turned into a residential area so we wouldn't shoot there, thinks respectful people that have manners and sense don't break the rules, but there needs something in place for people that are not being respectful, we all came out here to buy property, the fact that they can do whatever they want but you and I are stuck having to live with it or move is not a fair position to put anybody in.

A citizen asked about laws in place for certain restrictions on when you can shoot, can't shoot within so many feet of house, are there restrictions? A citizen said absolutely not. A citizen spoke to on Christmas Day standing on back deck, heard shooting, neighbor had a handgun

target shooting, but bullet was coming across property, thru the woods and zinging by her husband's head. We should not be put in those circumstances on Christmas Day with family. We should be able to shoot but thinks there needs to be regulations when near edge of property and shooting a long-range gun, need regulations.

Dr. Susan Bodin of Riddles Bridge, stated she moved here five years ago to get away from what was going on in Henrico County, overcrowding and regulations, loves hearing cows in the morning and roosters crow, yes we do hear dogs occasionally and yes hears shooting from hunters, we shoot ourselves, also knows all of her neighbors and when there is an issue I am comfortable enough and we have a strong enough relationship where she can go to her neighbor and say hey can we negotiate something, for us personally has not been a problem, worried about the slippery slope and would not like to see any further regulation at this point.

Willy Icenhour, 2596 Sandy Hook Rd., is a responsible citizen who frequently yells for his pet dog to come home late at night because of something breaking the perimeter of his property, dog is trained to only bark when he sees someone or another animal break the perimeter to protect he and his family, that his family target practices on their property only during daylight hours several times a month being very safe and responsible, key word responsible, we also enjoy riding Harley Davidson motorcycles, sometimes we have a party with loud music, sometimes he may be working in his garage with his music up loud, maybe working on one of his vehicles and uses his air compressor, has a busted muffler on his lawn mower and is really loud, every once in a while may yell for his children to come home, may yell several times for them, sounds like I could get into some serious trouble and suffer some serious consequences, so with that being said, is totally against a noise ordinance.

Thomas Ford, 1521 Hilltop Circle, lives in Rivercliff subdivision, bought lot in 1987, subdivision has ordinances, restrictions, one of the reasons he bought in the area was because of the covenants and restrictions in there that apply to him and everybody else that owns a lot in there, of restrictions on use of property, read from Section 2...Quiet Enjoyment...it says no obnoxious or offensive activity shall be carried on upon the properties nor shall anything be done which may become a nuisance or a noise to other owners." That includes me and includes my neighbor, my neighbor has decided he is a one man army, doesn't know what he is shooting, it must be 16-20 round clips, not far from my door, 200' maybe, you would think you are in Vietnam or Iraq, loud noise, they say it cannot be automatic fire, maybe it is not but he has a quick trigger, it is loud, has nothing against hunting, he hunts, has nothing against shooting, he shoots, but this noise is unreasonable and thinks something could be crafted pro or con, doesn't know how you would draw it up from an attorney's point, but just what this says...no obnoxious or offensive activity should occur, it is that simple.

David Winchester, stated his problem with noise is music, lives in a neighborhood, is a poor man he cannot afford a big piece of land, so lives in a neighborhood, likes his home, likes his peace and quiet with his neighbor, his neighbor doesn't feel that way, Sheriff's Department is very familiar with him - he has called hundreds of times to complain and time and time again is told he has a right to make noise, I asked what about my right to peace and quiet, apparently I have no rights, works hard to pay for his place and he cannot come home and enjoy it, how would you like riding home from work and wonder what you are going to hear when you come home, thinks we definitely need a noise ordinance for music.

Floyd Fleming, Pony Farm Rd, thinks we need a noise ordinance but has to be realistic, neighbor likes shooting automatic weapons, doesn't have a problem with but at 11PM at night he does, thinks it has to have a time frame when people can shoot or allowed to shoot outside, loves fireworks, sympathizes with folks who have issues when fireworks go off, once a year thinks there needs to be some exceptions for fireworks from a patriotic standpoint, but if it becomes a nuisance it has to stop, key word is nuisance. Lack of respect, when becomes a nuisance to your neighbors then if you can't control it then there needs to be an ordinance to control it, we all like our rights, we moved to the country to live here and do things we want but we need to be respectful of our neighbors, if people cannot discipline themselves then there needs to be some type of regulation.

Joseph Ligon stated he has lived in the county his whole life (45 years), family has been here since at least the mid 1800's, we farm and spoke to agriculture noise, of lady who rents across the street from us who called Animal Control several years ago complaining the cows were bawling after we sold the calves, they are going to bawl, nothing you can do, depends on how noise ordinance is written, agriculture noises need to be left out of. The other problem is that noise/nuisance ordinances can have is people use it as weapons. Remembers the discussion in 2008, Sheriff Agnew was there, the Board asked how many complaints they had, and there were 900+/-, Sheriff Agnew testified at least 75% of them were from two people in the county, not sure if his memory is correct with that (978 complaints in 10 years, that's 97 complaints a year for a county that has 22,000 people), less than a 100 complaints a year for noise problems, if you are averaging out; it doesn't sound like we have a true noise problem. Obviously, there are some individual situations, referenced gentleman with a covenant contract stating it sounds like a civil suit, of gentleman who sued and got his dog problem taken care of, that there was a way to resolve the issue, of being able to take care of covenant restriction problems through civil court, and added automatic weapons are not illegal in county, or anywhere else in the country if properly licensed and registered as of a 1934 act, and the 86-87 gun owners protection act, they are legal, if its legal and registered, it's legal noting covenants are civil solution to a problem, not a public nuisance ordinance. You can sue someone in civil court for making a nuisance under your C&R. When it comes to shooting, it needs to be done safely obviously, if bullets are coming across your property that is a problem, no proper back stop, (of different types of ordinances that can regulate different types of things, noise would not address that particular area, of state code

components that could be considered to address), in general - shooting needs to be protected, it is Goochland County, full of firearms, people shoot, issue seems to be when it gets to point of being a nuisance and being able to address it, now how you do that and codify that and how you make that not useable as a weapon where you have someone who is not a supporter of shooting that outrageously decides I don't like guns at all, I'm going to keep calling the Sheriff until that guy is gone, how do you prevent that in the ordinance, is there a way to write the ordinance that there is a mechanism for the supposed perpetrator to resolve the issue, where you have someone who is abusing the noise ordinance against them to get a positive result back if someone does use it as a club whether the noise is shooting or whether cows, or somebody's dogs or whatever, if you have someone who is going to call 300 times and this gentleman is going to show up from animal control because the dogs are barking, even if the dogs aren't barking, but they are calling in, what recourse does the person being affected negatively by the noise ordinance have to go against person making illegitimate calls. How to prevent any ordinance we write from being used as an abusive weapon by an annoying neighbor, false accusations, how do you defend yourself against, that needs to be addressed as well.

Greg Trojan, 5354 Broad Street Rd, Shannon Hill stated the reason he moved out to the county was to have a place for his horses, neighbor has ATV's and they ride them all Saturday, sounds like freedom to me, my neighbor across the street shoots all day Saturday, doesn't know how he affords ammunition, sound of freedom, neighbor across the street has dogs and they bark a lot, anytime somebody comes near their property but is what they are supposed to do, still the sound of freedom and protection for his family. Only problem we have in the whole neighborhood and everybody has a gun in Shannon Hill, is the lady who moved in from the big city who now thinks she has this utopian idea of what rural life is like and it should be quiet and the birds singing, we have horses, sheep, goats, peacocks, ginnies, we are agricultural, so why she decided to move into an agricultural area with farm animals he has no idea.

Jewell Gardner, Greg's neighbor, lives across the street, has dogs, has been here 23 years, husband drives a tractor/trailer, we have dogs, we have guns, has concealed carry, has a 12 year old daughter that goes to middle school, subs at school, some of the families that we have moving in the county thinks are more transient, they are not staying here 10 years+, person shooting may be a renter, older people may need income and rent, doesn't want her rights controlled either, trains her 12 year to shoot a gun, too much going on in this world to not have some protection, you can't fix stupid, doesn't know how you do that, doesn't want folks to regulate her rights, thinks everybody has needs, but doesn't want another bureaucrat in her back pocket telling her what she can and cannot do, did property management and knows about HOA's, stood on board for one and people can abuse it, if we do it and don't do it right, is moving out of county, that her dogs can get irritating, they are two year old puppies, it is irritating but Greg has not complained about me nor I him, we are country people in the Hadensville area, if problems with someone, go talk with him first, do you really always have to

call Sheriff Agnew, not necessarily, we need to be considerate of each other, if somebody is shooting across her porch she is not going to be happy about.

Richard Willis stated the document doesn't lie, 948 noise complaints from 2008-2018, these were not one person calls a hundred times, addresses show they came from different people, keep your noise on your side of the property line, if it is disturbing/disruptive/difficult to manage then cut the noise out, shut it down as a courtesy to your neighbors.

Mr. Budesky stated data has come up several times, the Sheriff has provided us with some data, as the Board considers anything moving forward, we will make sure it is data inclusive as well as any comments.

Pete Lenk, Pony Farm Road stated his perspective is a little different, he is totally against any noise regulation of any sort, my background is probably different from anyone in this room, grew up in New York City, house was directly under flight landing path, of a big jet going over his house every 60-90 seconds, all day long, you learn to tune it out, has gone through the automatic gun fire and had to call the Sheriff and held receiver up for dispatcher, neighbor was shooting towards 64 with an automatic weapons and no buffer, Sheriff came out and said we cannot do anything about it, it's legal, a week later they were shooting, one of the kids came running through the woods yelling hold your fire, hold your fire, same people, Sheriff came out, couldn't do anything about, they have since moved, that I64 is at his back property line, occasionally hears tractor trailers, you can tune noise out, is totally against any noise regulation.

Citizen spoke to say thinks we believe to have an ordinance limits or reduces our freedoms, understands what freedom is about, fought for it, but like it has been said, ordinances can protect your freedoms, perhaps improperly written or imposed ordinance could limit them, but if properly written, some of us who have had infringements on our freedoms and our safety, could be protected. Person who lived next to me was creating rapid gunfire all hours of day and night, did call the Sheriff, was told there is nothing in terms of a noise ordinance. Also they don't have a back stop, not using 4 acres of land to run my stock that I could be using, I know that there is something a little shady going on down there, was told by official folk that it probably wasn't the best idea that I reach out and be neighborly, there are those situations and in those situations, we wish that everything that could be done could be handled with a handshake but this is a very serious issue as it is to others and we are not losing freedoms, we are only having freedoms protected and properly written ordinances can protect those people who do not understand what reasonable might be.

Wendy Hobbs stated she was warden at The Correctional Center for Women in Fluvanna, was Regional Administrator over 14 prisons, we could not do a firing range without considering the economic impact, was very costly to have a range, you had to worry about lead and wear it went, it had to be directed in a safe manner. That these independent firing ranges have that, that they have lead testing, backdrops to prevent bullets from going where they are not suppose to go, thinks if we are going to look at an ordinance, that is something we need to consider "safety"...to ensure our citizens aren't placed in danger because of someone out shooting their guns, and it doesn't matter how far back in the woods you may be, you still have an environmental impact. As far as freedom of right to bear arms, thinks everyone has that right, but we are talking about the safety of people, you don't have the right to put people at risk. Not sure how we would address animal noise, we are in the country, being neighborly, a good suggestion about animals, talk to your neighbors, the music noise she would consider maybe a timeline like when we have businesses that come into our communities, events, time they begin/end.

Citizen said issue tonight is noise, we keep talking about nuisance, when we get into nuisance (ink pen clicking example), before we start writing into law a nuisance, let's quantify it. If we are going to do something about noise, use some scientific backing. Of an industry standard to protect your hearing, at what decibels are you required to wear hearing protection, so if we are going to place some sort of law or limit something make it to wear it is across the board, whether guns, dogs, noise, music, some sort of decibel rating. ATV's and devices and decibel level/reading, they measure, so that if it goes into something where no matter what size acreage of your property is, if I am inside my house and something is defined and everybody can agree on at a level that is disturbing (85 is required hearing protection), if I'm inside my house and something becomes a nuisance then I have something to measure it by than can then be legally checked against, like a speedometer. As far as the law, is on the side that it can be used against you, reference to his lab dog, lives in Mill Forest, people have 2-3 dogs, we have a puppy and were trying to house train him, needless to say anything that runs through the yard he is going to bark, started getting nasty grams from his HOA, tried to explain to them he is trying to train the dog, that he can't control what he smells and stuff, they offered him the suggestion to get the dog's bark taken out/have surgery on dog, has spent \$400-\$500 on bark control devices, that he is somehow able to get out of and chew up, dog is to protect property. Lived in a different county and property was broken into twice, looked at security systems, was told the best security system is a dog, neighbors don't want him to leave his dog outside during day because it disturbs them, he is inside his house, dog barks in yard he has to consciously listen for him unless at the front door, how is that bothering someone behind me, what decibel reading is it in their house, are they trying to be annoying to me. Before we go down this path, I'd like to see some scientific level of justifying what it is, not just left up to an opinion of am I a nuisance.

Avis Binford, Dogtown Road spoke to the whole slippery slope thing, because when she does research and looks at other counties' ordinances, they almost always have a variation for the hunters. Is not against hunting, let's two people hunt on her land, but hunters (90% white, 70%

male), is a slippery slope, we have ordinances to police certain people like hunting dogs that come on your property without a leash, you have to give them reasonable time to come get their dog(s), of policing everyone but we are going to make exceptions for hunters on everything, not against the exception, regulating something that doesn't require regulating always leads to a slippery slope. What about people who do shift work, so if I don't get off until a certain time, then what about my time, I may want to rest at 12 noon but you may think that is a perfectly good time to cut your grass, by most standards it would be, everybody doesn't work 9-5 anymore, that is a reality. We are country people, most of us don't live in subdivisions, knows that is changing, but we don't rent club houses to have our celebrations, we celebrate on our acreage at home, that is a sacred memory, but for someone who is a light sleeper, yes, does appreciate having quiet, doesn't expect the county to fix my every complaint and it not cost me something. If we start at the big end of the horn, the regulating thing, we are going to go down a slippery slope. The idea that other counties do it (have a noise ordinance), doesn't care what other counties do, I'm more concerned about what Goochland wants to do, one of the benefits of living in Goochland has to be is that we get to be Goochland. And heard the comment about making room for progress, more people moving in, disagrees with that, the Board has heard me several times disagree with the dog leash law. We started at the big end of the horn, there were other options. Spoke to cities that have site/sound tags for dogs that are properly trained, walks trails with her dog and runs into no one, but we started with the dog leash law instead of somewhere in the middle. This is a rural community, and it is her favorite thing about living in Goochland, so here is another chance at an ordinance and we have to be really careful because how other people do it isn't necessarily how we should do it, reference to Henrico, there are major cities scrambling to get what we have in a rural community, we have to be careful not to throw that away, we cannot get it back, you can lose a million dollars and get it back, you cannot lose rural America and get it back, just doesn't happen. Doesn't pretend to have the answer, just concerned with us over regulating, over legislating something and causing more problems than set out to solve.

Citizen spoke to the disaster with the Orapax shooting range a few years back, 700 acres, definitely had people show up from the housing development next to high school and screaming and hollering that the noise was terrible at Orapax, you have to do something about it, they ended up with the zoning board playing silly games, restricting hours of operation to the point where they never actually opened a functioning facility over there because of that. The point is the decibel levels that were measured by the firm county hired, of people so offended by any little thing that happens that they don't like, we end up losing what we moved out here for in the first place.

County Administrator Budesky thanked all for coming out, there are obviously passions on both sides of the issue, we started the meeting saying that we aren't promising a regulation but are agreeing to listen, we have taken notes and translating the minutes of the meeting. We are going

to break into smaller groups for those who did not want to speak in a group or would like to share more directly.

Kim Barton, moved from Henrico County, opposed to an ordinance, has range in backyard, loves the freedoms of rural living in Goochland and includes noise, concerned about neighbors setting off alarms.

Good Evening,

I have been a lifelong resident of Goochland County, and I don't plan on changing that. I sat in the meeting at the old middle school and listened to all my fellow constituents this evening on both sides of the aisle concerning a noise ordinance. My position is that we should not start pacifying a select few citizen's requests to further regulate our tax paying majority of citizens. No noise ordinance is needed on any level because it's a perceived problem by a select few. One gentleman stated that there has been roughly 940 noise related complaints from 2008 to 2018. Assuming our county has 20,000 citizens in it, there are roughly 19,906 people that don't file a complaint each year. That would also be assuming each complaint was filed by a different person and it wasn't repeat complainants. Since one man said he has made "hundreds of complaints" in attendance tonight, I think you quickly begin to realize that we do not have a noise problem in Goochland. We

have a few people that are in bad situations with neighbors that aren't adult enough to work out their problems with their own neighbors, so they want to take the easy way out and have a bureaucrat force THEIR version of a resolution. This would be a very slippery slope to pursue, and quite frankly, an embarrassing one for the county to consider.

I heard multiple citizens state that they felt unsafe in their home because of nearby gunshots. Thanks for hosting the listening session last night. I very much appreciate the boards commitment to hear citizens out. I understand this is a delicate issue with citizens on both sides passionate about their plight. I learned that the 'nusiance' noise is really narrowed to 4 key issues atvs, guns, music and dogs barking.

I think some of the opposition present are often the offenders hiding under a mask of 'freedoms'. These are people who typically deem its their right to do whatever they want. However everything in this life is conditional. Most privileges and rights have some regulation because there are always those who will abuse it. Interestingly, I agree with both sides and am willing to hear those with opposing opinions out. Ultimately, my goal is to find a balance. You can't make everybody happy. However being told you have no recourse is truly disheartening and quite frankly unfair as I am also a citizen of this county who pays my taxes, and on time I might add. What about my rights and those of my family. I noted often those with opposing views didn't want to find common ground they just flat out rejected anything other than their point of view saying they shouldn't pay for it. However they are everytime a deputy has to respond to a similar call.

I bet some of the trespassing with atvs calls, shooting calls are not listed under noise issues. I would be curious to see how calls are logged because I bet there are more instances than expressed at the moment and many more that go unreported. I think many people are afraid to speak out. We were for a long time because we were told by our neighbor and the sheriff's office that one of the homes in question would retaliate. Out of fear we often didn't call and remained silent. We also were told by disoatcher there was nothing the deputies could do again, causing us not to call and report the behavior.

Unfortunately, it has shown that time and time again in our world people choose to violate those so called freedoms or privileges available to them, thus requiring laws and regulations to fall into place. Hence why we have governing bodies. Now your guns can be confiscated if your deemed mentally unfit, your driving privileges revoked if you make poor choices or at least penalized. Additionally, voting rights lost if you go to prison. I could go on an on with examples of rights and privileges that have conditional use around them. My point is there are always a few bad apples who ruin it for the masses. The fact someone is rude and cant manage themselves should not penalize me an my families ability to use our property in a peaceful way and without fear.

Make no mistake I am not complaining of one instance. I have endured multiple occurances of the same issues over and over, time an time again, year after year. I came out here to raise my kids in the country. I expect certain noise so let me be clear whats NOT an issue for me:

- \*business noise or traffic
- \*the occasional shooting (siting in and target)
- \*the occasional party or gathering
- \*the occasional atv riding

No sensible person has an issue with anyone doing an activity here or there for fun or otherwise. Where the problem is those that continue the behavior everyday or those that choose every saturday and/or sunday all day or late into the night often. I was raised to show respect and be considerate. If everyone shared those values the need for this ordinance would be mute but unfortunately we aren't currently living in a time like when I was a kid where neighbors generally got along and were respectful.

I also think the injustice to this process is calling it a 'noise ordinance' because that is not what it is. We aren't looking to target roosters, farm equipment or the like. Unfortunately that is the fear mongering which is taking place bc it is not being called what it is. I reference the post on Goochland moms last night where one of the attendees did just that. She did not present the concerns in a manner that provided the intent which is nuisance. We are also not talking about one offense but in many cases multiple infractions close together. She instead misrepresented what I understood were the objectives, nuisance noise. Not everybody is a good neighbor. Therefore people spoke out in opposition openly bc she mislead the intent of the noise ordinance. Why do we hear similar stories with people afraid to speak out and speak up. I believe this is a much bigger problem in this county than is being let on. So there are a few who scream no, no noise ordinance. They threatened to move but what about those of us who have often rode the sidelines saying nothing while continually dealing with an inconsiderate neighbor. That is what this fight is really about not regulating day to day noise or life's occassional sunday fun day. It is about regulating those who continue to be abusive because they can be. I shouldn't have to go hire an attorney to civilly deal with this. I should have a process in place that if I am willing to do my due diligence allows me to have recourse where currently none exist. It acts as a deterrent for the bad actors.

Many thanks to each of you for your time an patience. I do not envy any of you. I will remain a strong proponent of the board enacting some process for citizens with nusiance noise to have reasonable recourse so they to may continue to enjoy their home they have built within our community as they deem appropriate.

An ordinance to amend Chapter 10 (“Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions”) of the Goochland County Code by adding Sections 10-40 (“Prohibited noises generally”), 10-41 (“Specific acts as noise disturbances”), 10-42 (“Exemptions”), 10-43 (“Penalty and enforcement”) and 10-44 (“Severability”) to adopt provisions related to noise control

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of Goochland have expressed a need for more stringent control of unreasonably loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises; and

**WHEREAS**, noise can be detrimental to the health, welfare, safety and well-being of inhabitants of the County, and in the public interest noise should be restricted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors has reviewed numerous options available to obtain this goal without imposing regulations that are unduly restrictive; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors wishes to amend and update the County Code for the foregoing reasons; and

**WHEREAS**, this ordinance is required to serve the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Goochland County.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, that the Goochland County Code is hereby amended as follows:

1. Chapter 10 (“Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions”) is hereby amended as provided in the attachment.
2. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption by the Board of Supervisors of Goochland County.
3. Except as amended herein, all chapters, articles, sections, paragraphs and provisions of the Goochland County Code are readopted in their entirety as if set forth herein.

## Chapter 10. Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions

### Article II. Noise

#### Sec. 10-40. Prohibited noises generally.

It shall be a violation of this article for any person to make noise or allow the making of noise that by reason of its volume, pitch, duration or repetition, considering the time of day, is likely to disturb the rest of a person or interfere with such person's lawful and peaceful enjoyment of property owned or rented by him or that constitute any one of the specific acts of noise disturbances enumerated in this article.

#### Sec. 10-41. Specific acts as noise disturbances.

The following acts are declared to be noise disturbances in violation of this article, provided that this list shall not be deemed to be an exclusive enumeration of those acts which may constitute noise disturbances and that an act not listed below may nevertheless constitute a violation of this article.

1. *Social gatherings and parties.* Any noise generated between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. from a gathering of ten (10) or more people that is plainly audible (i) inside the confines of a detached dwelling unit of another person or (ii) at one hundred (100) or more feet from the gathering.
2. *Sound-producing and sound-reproducing devices.* The use, operation or playing of any radio, phonograph, television, record, compact disc, tape, digital music, MP3 or DVD player, musical instrument, loudspeaker, sound amplifier or other machine or device capable of producing or reproducing sound, regardless of whether such sound-producing or sound-reproducing machine or device is located inside of, outside of or on a structure, in such a manner or with such volume or duration that it is plainly audible between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., (i) inside the confines of a detached dwelling unit of another person or (ii) at one hundred (100) or more feet from the device.
3. *Noisy animals.* Allowing any animal, except farm animals in agricultural districts, to cause any sound or noise between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. such that it is plainly audible (i) inside the confines of a detached dwelling unit of another person at least once a minute for ten (10) consecutive minutes or (ii) at one hundred (100) or more feet from the animal at least once a minute for ten (10) consecutive minutes.
4. *Trash and recycling collection.* The creation of any sound or noise between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. that is plainly audible when the sound or noise is produced in connection with the loading or unloading of refuse, waste or recycling collection vehicles.

5. Street cleaning and construction. The creation of any sound or noise between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. that is plainly audible when the sound or noise is produced in connection with (i) the cleaning of streets or parking lots or (ii) construction or demolition activities.
6. Peddlers and hawkers. Yelling, shouting, whistling, screaming or crying for the purpose of attracting attention to a performance, show, sale or display of merchandise between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on any public street, sidewalk or parking lot or any privately-owned street, sidewalk or parking lot open to the public, except to summon aid in an emergency.
7. Amplified sound from vehicles. Playing, using or operating, or permitting the playing, use or operation of, any radio, stereo, tape player, compact disc player, MP3 player, loud speaker or other electronic device or mechanical equipment used for the amplification of sound, which is located on or within a motor vehicle and which is plainly audible from outside the motor vehicle at a distance of one hundred (100) feet or more. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to the playing of music or jingles by an ice cream truck or similar mobile food-service vehicle, provided such vehicle may emit sounds otherwise prohibited by this subsection only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
8. Lawn care activities. Creating any sound or noise plainly audible between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. in connection with lawn care, leaf removal, gardening, tree maintenance or removal or other landscaping, lawn or timbering activities. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to sound or noise generated by the maintenance of recreational facilities such as golf courses and ball or playing fields.
9. On or off road motor vehicles, etc.
  - (a) The operation of or use of any on or off road motor vehicle, all-terrain vehicle, moped, motor-driven cycle, motorcycle or motorized skateboard or scooter for a period in excess of five (5) minutes in duration or a total of fifteen (15) minutes during any twenty-four (24) hour period whether on public or private property, not meeting the standards of Title 46.2 of the Code of Virginia pertaining to mufflers and exhaust systems;
  - (b) The operation or use of any on or off road motor vehicle, all-terrain vehicle, moped, motor-driven cycle, motorcycle or motorized skateboard or scooter that is so out of repair, so loaded or operated in such a manner as to create loud and unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling, squealing of tires, revving of motor or other noise; or
  - (c) The discharge of the exhaust of any internal combustion engine into the open air except through a device which will effectively prohibit loud and explosive noises.

10. Sounding of horns or other warning devices. Sounding the horn or warning device of a vehicle, except when necessary as a warning during the operation of the vehicle.

**Sec. 10-42. Exemptions.**

The prohibitions of this article shall not apply to any sound or noise generated by any of the following:

1. Sound or noise which is necessary for the protection or preservation of property or the health, safety, life or limb of any person, including noise caused by or arising out of activities related to the repair, maintenance, replacement or alteration of public utility systems or parts thereof, public drainage systems or parts thereof, or streets and highways or parts thereof, and appurtenances thereto, where such activity is reasonable necessary to further a public safety interest and/or to minimize disruption in the provision of public services, e.g., water, sewer and electrical services.
2. Emission of sound for the purpose of alerting persons to the existence of an emergency or the emission of sound in the performance of emergency work.
3. Radios, sirens, horns and bells on police, fire or other emergency response vehicles.
4. Parades, fireworks displays, school-related activities and other such public special events or public activities.
5. Band performances or practices, athletic contests or practices and other school-sponsored activities on the grounds of public or private schools, colleges or universities.
6. Athletic contests and other officially-sanctioned activities in County-owned parks and recreational facilities.
7. Fire alarms, burglar alarms and car alarms, prior to the giving of notice and a reasonable opportunity for the owner or person in possession of the premises or vehicle served by any such alarm to turn off the alarm.
8. Religious services, religious events or religious activities or expressions, including, but not limited to music, singing, bells, chimes and organs which are part of such service, event, activity or expression.
9. Locomotives or railroad equipment.
10. Sounds emanating from areas permitted by the Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy or any division thereof.

11. Military activities of the Commonwealth or of the United States of America.
12. Agricultural operations, as defined in Section 3.2-300 of the Code of Virginia and sawmills, provided such operations comply with all other applicable laws, regulations and ordinances.
13. Political gatherings and other activities protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.
14. Activities for which the regulation of noise has been preempted by federal law.
15. Business being performed on industrial property.

**Sec. 10-43. Penalty and enforcement.**

1. *Civil Penalties:* Any person may request that the magistrate issue, ~~and an animal control officer (as to animal noise) or other code enforcement officer may issue,~~ a civil summons to any person violating the provisions of this article. Any person found violating any provision of this article shall pay a civil penalty not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each first offense and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each subsequent offense.
2. *Continued violation:* Each day a violation continues unabated shall constitute a separate offense.
3. *Responsible person:* The person operating or controlling a noise source shall be guilty of any violation caused by that source. If that cannot be determined, any owner, tenant, resident or manager physically present on the property where the violation is occurring shall be presumed to be operating or controlling the noise source. It shall be unlawful for a property owner knowingly to allow other persons to create noise prohibited by this article within the boundaries of his or her property.
4. *Injunctive relief:* In addition to and not in lieu of the penalties prescribed in this section, the County may apply to the circuit court for an injunction against the continuing violation of any of the provisions of this article and may seek any other remedy or relief authorized by law.

**Sec. 10-44. Severability.**

If any provision of this article should be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this article.
