







Redistricting

- Staff's plan was to wait on the adopted state lines before redistricting, in order to avoid split precincts
- The Virginia Redistricting Commission, under the state law timing, would have had maps ready by mid-November
- Given the lack of progress at the state level, staff recommends starting local redistricting process now

Election District Redistricting Requirements & Criteria

Election District Legal Requirements

1. Substantially equal in population
2. Contiguous and compact
3. Race not predominate factor
4. Clearly observable boundaries
5. Consider state election districts



Additional Permissible Criteria for Election Districts

1. Move the fewest number of voters to minimize voter disruption
2. Retain the same basic shape of current districts.
3. Keep residents who live in the same subdivision in the same district



Precincts & Polling Places

Legal Requirements

1. Precincts must have between 100-5,000 registered voters
2. Each precinct must have an available polling place
3. No split precincts – must be consistent with state election districts
4. Precinct lines must follow clearly observable boundaries



Redistricting Process

Redistricting Process

Step 1: Create Proposed Map

- Base Map from Legal Requirements
- Staff revise based on Additional Criteria & create Proposed Map
- Proposed Map to BoS publicly
- Proposed Map on website for public in December



Redistricting Process

Step 2: Community Input

- Public comments posted on Redistricting Website for at least 30 days
- 3 community meeting dates in January advertised through
 - Postcards to all residents
 - *Gazette* ads
 - Social media posts
- Transcripts of public comments from community meetings posted to website



Redistricting Process

Step 3: Adopt Map

- At end of public comments, staff will review & make any changes needed
- If new state lines are available, will make any changes needed for those
- All changes incorporated into a proposed Final Map
- Proposed Final Map on website for public comment for 15 days
- Board of Supervisors public hearing & adoption of proposed Final Map

Criteria

1. Move fewest voters
2. Retain basic shape of districts
3. Same subdivision in same district

Process

1. Proposed map to BoS publicly. Post for public.
2. All comments posted on website. 3 community meetings.
3. Revise map, if needed, and post for 15 days. Board public hearing & adoption
